

PRESENTATION

MIGREUROP is a euro-african network of organisations, activists and researchers.

Its aim at identifying, denouncing and spreading information about the consequences of European migration policies at all stages of the exile process: hindrances to mobility, closure of borders, formal and informal detention, various forms of deportation, as well as the externalisation of migration controls and asylum by European states.

In this way, the network contributes to defending migrants' fundamental rights (including the right to "leave any country including their own") and to promoting freedom of movement and settlement.

The network relies on the expertise of its members (48 associations and 46 individual members), based in 17 countries in Europe, Africa and the Middle East.

DECODING EUROPEAN MIGRATION POLICIES

WORK AREAS

gather information on IDENTIFY: obstacles to the mobility of people on the move, through the organisation of field missions and exchanges with the Euro-African members of the network

DECODE and name the multi-faceted reality of distancing people on the move, embodied by a whole set of devices which constitute points of forced interruption in migration routes.

SPREAD INFORMATION on the non-welcoming Europe, on the Europe of camps, and the mobilisations that oppose them by creating decoding tools, organising awareness-raising events, and by using all means of dissemination to inform as widely as possible.

DENOUNCE AND FIGHT: act by all means at the European level to fight migration policies hostile to people on the move.

POSITIONING STATEMENTS:

June 20, 2010: Call for the closure of camps for migrants, in Europe and beyond

"Migreurop demands that governments of EU member states and its neighboring countries to stop resorting to detention as a tool for controlling migration flows, and calls for civil society to oppose the system of detention of migrants."

December 18, 2013: Solemn call for freedom of movement: "Claiming the right to come, to go and to settle for everyone, woman or man, in the name of the principle of equality constitutes an indispensable corollary to the defence of the rights of migrants. This is why, in continuity with its activities and struggles, effective Migreurop demands the implementation of freedom of movement, as a means for social change for the sake of a fairer and more equitable model of society."
